#### **Introduction**

Full Professor of English linguistics at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia, Department of Studies on Language and Culture.

I graduated in Foreign Languages and Literature from the University of Pisa. I hold an MA in Language Studies from the University of Lancaster (UK) and a PhD in English Linguistics from the University of Pisa (Italy). I obtained the qualification for the position of researcher (English Linguistics) in 2005, taking service at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia. I rose to the position of Associate Professor in English linguistics in 2015 at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia.

#### **Research Interests**

My initial research interest was in English conversation analysis and speech studies. Subsequently, I turned my attention to the study of English for academic purposes, focusing on textual and pragmatic aspects of different genres, on the argumentative structure of texts and on the potential of qualitative and quantitative analysis of small specialised corpora.

Another line of research concerns the analysis of legal language, approached from a pragmatic and contrastive (English-Italian) perspective.

I have recently explored the popularisation strategies adopted in print and in digital texts targeting young people and in law blogs.

I have participated in seven national projects PRIN 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2015, 2020, 2022; I have obtained two University Research Grants (FAR) in 2016 and 2022 and a grant awarded by MIUR for research activities in 2017.

I have presented papers at national and international conferences.
