Nadia Garbellini is Associate Professor at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia, Department of Linguistic and Cultural Studies, where she is responsible for teaching in the field of Political Economy.

She holds the qualification for the role of Full Professor (Professore di I fascia) in SSD STEC-01/A (History of Economics) and SECS-P/01 (Political Economy).

She holds the qualification for the role of Associate Professor (Professore di II fascia) in SSD SECS-P/02 (Economic Policy).

Nadia Garbellini's research interests lie mainly in the field of theory of value, international trade, international division of labour, technological innovation and labour productivity.

Since 2022, Nadia Garbellini has been a member of the Steering Committee of the Bachelor's Degree Program in European Languages and Cultures. Since 2024, she has been the tutor coordinator for the Bachelor's Degree Program in History And Contemporaneity.

Education

Nadia Garbellini graduated in Economics from the University of Pavia in 2007 (grade 110/110). In 2011 she obtained a PhD in Economics at the Catholic University of Milan, with a thesis on structural economic dynamics. During her PhD she participated in two PRINs, both coordinated by Neri Salvadori.

In the following two years she held a research grant and a collaboration contract with the Centre for Development Cooperation of the University of Pavia as researcher and project manager of a cooperation project with Palestine. In the following two years, she held two research grants at the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Bergamo. Subsequently, she has been lecturer in various subjects related to the field of Political Economy in several Italian universities (Pavia, Varese, Bergamo, Cattolica di Milano, Bicocca, Statale di Milano) and the holder of several research grants funded by INET (Institute for New Economic Thinking).

Main research experience

Nadia Garbellini's research has always been in the field of structural economic dynamics from both a theoretical and, above all, empirical point of view – by means of network theory and Input-Output analysis. After her doctorate, her applied research focused mainly on the themes of productivity dynamics and global value chains.

Research on these topics has been carried out in the context of research grants at Italian universities; research grants from the Institute for New Economic Thinking (New York); collaboration with Transform! (New York); collaboration with Transform! Europe (political research foundation, partially funded by the European Parliament) and the Rosa Luxemburg Foundation (political research foundation, partially funded by the German government) for which she coordinated several research projects on the topics of global value chains, industrial policies, Industry 4.0 and the interconnections of all these aspects.

She has presented numerous papers at national and international conferences, and has worked as a consultant with ECLAC (United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America).

Nadia Garbellini is an anonymous referee of several international scientific journals (Cambridge Journal of Economics, Structural Change and Economic Dynamics, Economic System Research, Review of Political Economy, Journal of Evolutionary Economics, International Journal of Political Economy). She is a member of the Italian Association for the History of Political Economy (Storep) and of the International Input-Output Association (IIOA).

Other Activities

As for public engagement activities, Nadia Garbellini is a member of the Economic Advisory Board of the Party of the European Left, the CGIL Economic Forum, and the Steering Committee of the Claudio Sabattini Foundation. She has also delivered numerous training courses for managers, officials, and delegates of FIOM-CGIL, FLAI-CGIL, and FILCTEM-CGIL.
