Cecilia Robustelli is Full Professor of Italian Linguistics in the Department of Linguistic and Cultural Studies. She graduated with honours in Classical Linguistics from the University of Pisa and she specialised in Italian Linguistics (Master and PhD) at the University of Reading with scholarships from the Accademia dei Lincei-British Academy and the CNR. She has carried out scientific and teaching activities in England (London Royal Holloway and Cambridge) and in the United States as a Fulbright Visiting Scholar (Cornell University).

She teaches Italian Linguistics and Language and Gender in the Bachelor of Arts in European Languages and Cultures, and Linguistic Strategies and Digital Tools for Institutional Communication in the Master's degree programme Languages for Communications in International Enterprises and Organizations. In Michaelmas Term 2016 she was a Visiting Fellow at Trinity Hall, Oxford, and Visiting Professor in the Faculty of Linguistics, Philology and Phonetics, University of Oxford.

She is a member of the department's Digital Humanities Centre, the ROBOMORE University Research Group, and the University's Doctoral School in the Humanities, CUG. She is a delegate of the Rector and coordinator of the CRUI Language and Gender Working Group. In 2019 she founded at DSLC Unimore the Gender, Language, Digital Communication Laboratory (GLiC_D).

She participates in national and international research projects and networks, is on the Advisory Board of the journals *Gender/Sexuality/Italy* and *Media Languages and Cultures*, is responsible for Erasmus exchanges with the universities of Bergen, Copenhagen, Ljubljana and Warsaw and for agreements with the universities of Auckland (New Zealand) and Canberra (Australia).

Since 2000, she has been collaborating with Accademia della Crusca on the following issues:

(a) Italian language policy in Europe, as its representative in the European Federation of National Institutions for Languages (EFNIL) and member of the REI Expert Group (Network of Excellence of Institutional Italian) at the Directorate-General for Translation (DGT) of the European Commission, in which she coordinates the Gender Equality Working Group; (b) Observatory on Italianisms in the World (IOM); (c) administrative language, as president of the Association for the Quality of Administrative Acts (AquAA) established at the Institute of Theory and Techniques of Legal Information in Florence (ITTIG-CNR); (d) gender language. She was responsible for the Modena Unit in the FIRB project VIVIT - VIVI ITALIANO (Integrated digital archive of didactic materials, texts and iconographic and multimedia documentations for the knowledge abroad of the Italian linguistic and historical-cultural heritage, with particular regard to second and third generation Italians abroad).

She has been a consultant to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, Chamber of Deputies, MIUR in the Group of Gender Experts at the CPO of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers; in the Technical Committee for the elaboration of the guidelines for the implementation of c.16, art.1 of Law 107/2015 at MIUR; in the Technical Committee of the Project Changing Relationships through Education and Awareness Towards ending Violence against Wom of the European Commission, Dept. Coordinated the Working Group for the drafting of the Guidelines for Gender Respect in the Institutional Language of MIUR which were presented in 2018.
